Dear Mr. and Mrs. Snyder:


You really have a misconception about "the system". Nobody convinced Govenor Hodges to do anything.

That person filled out a form, stamped Governor Hodges' signature to it and sent it to the Goose Creek Police Department. The officer arrested Joseph; Dawn called me; I got in touch with a judge; she set a bond hearing; Joseph got out of jail; the "warrant" was held in abeyance because Joseph did not sign a waiver to be extradited; South Carolina law dictates that the Governor's designee (in this case an assistant attorney general who handles these types of paperwork problems) held a "hearing" that Joseph did not show up for; he sent his "recommendation" to the clerk in Gov. Hodges' office who got a pre-signed form off the shelf and filled in Joseph's name and sent it to the Goose Creek Police Department to pick Joseph up.
