## TABLE GAMES DROP MONEY SLOT

A casino table money drop slot, also known as a drop box or cash drop, is a secured slot or opening embedded in the casino table where money (bills, chips, and tokens) collected from winning bets are deposited.

Casino table money drop slot

Here's what it looks like and how it works:

Location: The drop slot is typically located in the either of the table, within easy reach of the dealer.

Design: It usually has a narrow opening to prevent accidental spills and unauthorized access. Some drop slots may have locking mechanisms for added security.

Purpose: The primary purpose of the drop slot is to securely collect and store money or chips during the game. This helps:

Prevent theft or loss: The money is secured within the table, minimizing the risk of theft or accidental loss.

Maintain table organization: Keeps the playing surface clear and organized, preventing clutter and distractions.

Facilitate counting and tracking: The collected money can be easily removed and counted by authorized personnel.

#### Additional details:

The frequency of emptying the drop slot varies depending on the casino and the amount of money collected. In some casinos, the drop slot may be connected to a central counting system for automated tracking and security purposes.

Not all casino tables have drop slots. For example, some poker tables may not have them due to the nature of the game and chip denominations used.
