





Front Panels & Scarf – My Involvement

The front of the uniform is the most visible area and represents my involvement in Scouting. This includes:

Australian Flag Badge: Worn above the pocket on the left-hand side of the shirt.

World Scout Badge: Worn alongside the Australian Flag badge, above the pocket on the left-hand side.

Unit Leader Badge: Worn on the top flap of the pocket.

Program Essentials – Milestones: Worn on the right-hand side of the shirt, approximately in line with or just below the Australian Flag badge on the left-hand side.

Event Badge: Only one event badge may be worn in this position at any given time. It must be removed within six months of the conclusion of the event.

Activity Badges: Worn above the pocket in a straight line. These badges are 1cm x 1cm in size.

Right Sleeve – My Identity

This part of the uniform recognises where you do your Scouting, your engagement with global initiatives under the Scouts4SDGs banner, additional awards you may have earned, and the section(s) you have been involved in.

The right sleeve includes:

Patrol Badge, Name Tapes, District and Region Badges

These represent your local community.

- Patrol Badge: Used in the Cub and Scout sections. These feature an image of an animal.
- 3rd 4th Colac Name Tape: Represents our Group.
- Geelong Region Badge: Shows the Region we are part of.
- Geelong Rivers District Badge: Shows the District we belong to.

Additional Awards: These awards are progressively becoming a consistent size and shape. They include, but are not limited to: Camper Award, First Aid, Personal Development Course Badge, SES, Their Service, Our Heritage, Adventurer's Journey Badge & Walkabout Award.

Introduction to Section Badges: These represent your journey through the Scouting sections.

Left Sleeve – My Journey

This part of the uniform recognises your journey in Scouting through the Achievement Pathways.

Peak Awards

A young person may wear all Peak Awards they have earned during their time in Scouting at the top of the left sleeve.

Special Interest Area Badges

Scouts may wear all Special Interest Area badges earned in the section they are currently a member of. These may initially form a hexagon shape, as shown in the diagram. There is no requirement to complete a project in each of the six Special Interest Areas. A Scout wears all badges representing the Special Interest Area projects they have completed.

Outdoor Adventure Skills

These badges form a 3×3 grid on the left sleeve.

Scouts only wear the highest achieved Stage in each of the nine activity/skill areas:

Bushcraft, Bushwalking, Camping, Alpine, Aquatics, Boating, Cycling, Paddling & Vertical

Any completed Stage should be recognised with the relevant badge.

Outdoor Adventure Skills Stages follow a young person throughout their Scouting journey. As a result, these badges may need to be moved or transferred between uniforms over time.
