

## *New Relationships*

Gahn, is a songteo (red taxi) driver Dwight has befriended since we have been here. They talk every Sunday. Last month Gahn was distressed over life’s circumstances and told Dwight he wanted to die. Dwight was able to pray with him, reassure him and share Jesus with him. After praying, Gahn stated he was not sure why he shared what he did but was glad for it. Gahn is not a believer in Jesus, yet. Please pray he will be some day soon.

Another recent experience really touched us. Early last week, Dwight had a flat tire on his bike which delayed him meeting the biking team he rides with every evening, so this day he rode alone. When he arrived at the bottom of a steep climb the rest of the team was coming down the hill. Surprisingly, when they saw Dwight, four of the team members turned around and went back up the steep hill with him. They said they couldn’t let their friend bike alone. When friends go the “extra mile,” you know your relationship is growing deeper.

Please pray that our relationships will continue to grow deeper and that our new friends will develop a relationship with Jesus. ## Business as Mission

As we have shared in past newsletters, our purpose on the mission field with Mission Aviation Fellowship's Learning Technology (LT) is to partner with Christian ministries and national leaders to provide resources for Leadership Training. In researching and praying through the challenges we have to overcome in establishing LT in SE Asia, we sensed God's direction is to start a Kingdom business synergistic with LT. All profits would be used to subsidize leadership training,


The business would hire Thai workers to do image-based data entry services for US organizations. A Learning Technology training center requires PC's and an internet connection for students to attend classes, the same equipment needed for remote data-entry services. During the day the learning center can be used for business purposes and the evening for leadership training. Employees can be cross-trained to work on either data-entry or prepare digital resources for Christian leaders. The same facilities used for training Christians would also fund the ministry.

A business has these additional benefits:

1. Reproducible in neighboring countries where Christian ministries are not welcome. An LT training center could be opened as a business, but used to train national Christian leaders.
2. Provides a work environment where Christ is glorified and His values are modeled. In SE Asia, workers are often taken advantage of and corruption is common. This business would stand apart and be a witness for Christ.
3. Jobs for the disadvantaged. Data-entry work does not require extensive education. Workers that have limited job opportunities could work at an LT learning center. *(For example, it is estimated up to 20% of Thai girls between the ages of 11 and 17 are kidnapped and sold into prostitution. Girls rescued out of prostitution could do data-entry work.)*
4. Be a Christian testimony to business and government leaders. These leaders (who are the middle and upper classes, wealthy and educated) can influence the nation. Currently there is little Christian witness directed towards these leaders.
5. Provides us with a business visa which allows us to remain in Thailand and facilitates travel to neighboring countries.
6. Potential of making the ministry self-funded.



**By faith we have moved ahead in opening the first learning center.** We will receive our business license from the Thai government in November. We are praying for financing, office space and that God will direct us to those to employ.
