



The Best Chicago Rooftops For Eating & Drinking

The best rooftop bars and restaurants for eating and drinking in Chicago.

Seville

Seville is on the roof of a Hilton in the Loop, and for a [hotel restaurant](#) in the shadow of the Willis Tower, the food is surprisingly good. The seasonal [Mediterranean](#) menu is mostly made up of tapas, plus large bowls of pasta, perfectly cooked fish, and some fantastic pinsa. Most dishes are the perfect size to split with a few people over drinks while sitting on the sprawling rooftop terrace—perfect for when you want a city view without having to press your nose against some glass Skydeck windows.
